



PRESIDENTS REPORT – Jimmy Legoe

With twelve rounds now behind us, the 2012 season is well and truly into the home stretch. This represents some exciting prospects for the Old Geelong Football Club with all four of our sides well and truly in finals contention. Our Senior side has not had this level of success since 2008 when we were promoted to C Section despite narrowly losing to Bulleen Templestowe in the Grand Final. As you will read on the following page, our Senior Coach (**Frank Dunell**) is as optimistic as I am about our chances in the next six rounds and beyond.

But it isn't the success of the Senior side that brings me the most enjoyment at the moment. It is that of our newly reinvigorated Under 19 team. The **O'Brien** brothers (**Simon & Dan**) are doing a fantastic job instilling a culture within our younger brigade that seems to be a reflection of that evident around the entire Club at the moment. We now have over 50 registered Under 19 players on our list with many being current school students at our two feeder schools, whilst parental support has been exceptional at nearly every game. I have no doubt that this drives the playing group to perform at their peak every Saturday which ultimately bodes very well for the future of our Club.

Our other two sides are also enjoying this same winning culture. **Chris Rubick's** Reserves are yet to taste defeat this season and sit well clear at the top of the table. Chrisso has experienced finals losses at the OGS in previous seasons and is preparing the group to give us the best opportunity to win yet another Reserves grade premiership. Meanwhile, first time Coach **Andrew Catchlove** has already clinched a finals spot for our ever improving Club XVIII team, the first in its history. We wish them all the best for their finals campaign which kicks off on Sunday August 12th.

I am also pleased to say that the good news doesn't stop on the field. We have held very well attended social functions including a sold out Pivot Lunch with **Frank Costa** as our guest speaker, Ladies Lunch with **Jack Trengrove** hosting our female supporters, OGFC Players Ball which was filled to capacity and most recently our inaugural Black Tie Legends Dinner where three stalwarts were acknowledged for their contributions to the Club – **Garth Manton, Peter Lemon** and **Michael Gretton-Watson**.

Behind the scenes, I can report that the Club finds itself in a vastly improved financial position with no debt to speak of. This of course would not be possible without the very generous support of our Sponsors (see back page) and Pivot Members. As a committee we set ourselves some lofty goals at the beginning of the season and whilst we are yet to reach all of them, we are certainly moving in the right direction. It has been a focus of ours to actively involve the OGS community as best we can, whilst at the same time further improving our cost controls. This has led us to establishing the **Old Geelong Football Club Foundation** that will provide a corpus of funds which will be used exclusively to ensure that the Old Geelong Football Club remains financially sound.

I look forward to joining you all in supporting the OGS toward premiership success in 2012!

OGFC SENIORS – Frank Dunell (Senior Coach)

With the current 2012 season more than half way over we have now reached the next stage in what golfers term "moving day". This is where golfers start to position themselves to enable them a shot at winning the tournament on Sunday. That's pretty much where we are presently, jockeying over the next four (4) weeks to have a crack at the finals before moving into the closing two (2) weeks. I think and many would agree that we have not yet played our best football yet and that we have plenty of upside to come.

Season review

After twelve (12) rounds we are well positioned with seven (8) wins, four (4) losses and sitting 4th on the ladder. Thirty – eight (38) players have had a taste of senior football this year with four (4) players playing every match. We have seen some outstanding performances in front of goal from **Cal Wood** and **Paul Ellis** who are both lying 2nd and 3rd respectively on the goal kicking ladder with **Ryan McEvoy** having arrived mid season burning up the charts behind them. We have had impressive away wins against quality opposition in Williamstown and Peninsula so far but equally unimpressive losses against Whitefriars, NOBs, and MHSOB. Our depth has been tested with senior players in **Archie Whiting** and **Alex Herd** who despite both having excellent form, received season ending injuries in the first half of the year. To exacerbate this further **Shaw Kitchen**, **James McArthur** and **Jack O'Shea** have all been travelling overseas, but the good news that they are likely to return to the fold over the next few weeks to help bolster the ranks coming into finals. What has been very pleasing to me though has been the ongoing improvement in form and fitness from players such as **Waters**, **Ratcliffe**, **Suvaltos**, **Fairbairn**, **Power**, **Burchell**, and **Oakley** (great comeback from broken ribs). The selections of some of our Under 19 players such as **Rupert Kemp**, **Andy de Fegely** and **Rupert de Crespigny** really bodes well for a strong future at the OGS looking ahead. This coupled with the wonderful consistent seasons from **Colby O'Brien**, **Cal Wood**, **Nick Bett**, **Hayden Timms**, **John Forster**, **Matt Collister**, **Reece Cordy**, **Dave Andrew** and the two towers in **Josh Hoevenaars** and **Gus Macdonald**, have all undoubtedly aided us significantly in our current ladder position.

What can we expect moving forward?

I am anticipating a big second half of the year from **Mike Rockefeller**, **Tom Lyons**, **Marcus Hastings**, **Paul Ellis**, **Shaw Kitchen**, **Jack O'Shea** and our inspirational captain **Ed Bayles** as he returns from a forced layoff. We will start to look dangerous again as these players start to build pressure again for positions in the side with matches against Ormond (a) Williamstown (h) and MHSOB (h). If we can win these matches it will lay a sound foundation leading into the clutch matches in the last three (3) rounds against Old Mentone (a) Whitefriars (a) and Peninsula (h). The match committee in **Marcus Hastings**, **Michael Holland**, and **Chris Rubick** have been working diligently at training to reshape our game to ensure players are more accountable over the ground and that our enthusiasm doesn't falter. We need to get ourselves in a good position to pounce on the other top sides in NOBs, Peninsula and Whitefriars who I believe have the potential to be our main stumbling blocks in achieving our quest to go up to C Section. However, I am confident that if we continue to work hard, make the commitment to each other and remain focused we have the group of players to beat these sides in the coming weeks. Be assured that we are the one club that is feared by the aforementioned teams. We demonstrated this when we beat the then undefeated Peninsula on their home ground. No one else has done this or likely to this year.

Re positioning

There is no question, NOBs are the best side at the moment and are hot favourites for the flag. That being the case they would be nervous in respect to that position. I would prefer to be playing our best football at the end of the season not at round twelve (12). I am happy over the next few weeks to rebuild our side for the run home. I am confident that if we remain composed, well organized, we will achieve the results we're after.

In conclusion

Over the coming weeks I will look to our leaders to ensure all players do that extra session if they missed training. To do the rehab on injuries that may occur. To do the appropriate recovery on a Sunday after a game to ensure they are ready to go on a Tuesday night. Our goal is to have all sides in the finals contention. This is important to having all players available, training and being match competitive through the final series. No other club will boast this in our division. Let's all make sure that we work collectively as a group now on and off the ground to ensure that this happens.

OGFC RESERVES – Chris Rubick (Reserves Coach)

It was April 21 and Round 1 when the reserves players of 2012 were introduced to the sting of our grand final loss in September of 2011. What has followed is an unbroken winning record that currently stands at 12. Suffice to say the response from the boys has been incredibly pleasing and their efforts thus far have been outstanding but the “challengers” are lining up as we make our run to September over the next 6 weeks. In that time we will play teams from 2nd to 7th on the ladder all desperate to knock us off and claim their spot in the finals. What will be vital is that we draw on the wins we have had so far including our last quarter come from behind victories against both Peninsula and Melbourne High. These moments were a great test of our strategy and structures but most importantly the character of our group which I believe will only grow stronger and we get to the business end of the season! I want to take this opportunity to thank and acknowledge **Jack Wall** for all his great work “on the magnets” each week as well as our ‘guru physio’ **Floss Brolsma**. Thanks also to **Frank, Marcus, Dutchy, Catchy** and the **O’Brien brothers** for their fantastic support and work on the track each week. We have laid a great foundation for success in 2012 it is now up to all of us to do everything it takes to be the last team standing.

OGFC UNDER 19’s – Simon & Danny O’Brien (Under 19 Co-Coaches)

Old Geelong Under 19’s in 2012 have been able to record some memorable victories as we just pass the half way point of the year. The highlight undoubtedly was the round 1 victory over current league leaders Ivanhoe, with a late goal securing victory. Recent victories over Williamstown and Therry Penola have the boys in the four eyeing off a finals appearance. In years past the OGs “Unders” have struggled in university holidays, but due the assistance of **David Oman** and **Shem Fitzgerald** at GGS the side has been greatly bolstered in this time with an influx of School players - the following have pulled on the hoops in recent weeks → **Charles Burbury, Will Evans, Jock Grimshaw, Will Holmes, George McFarlane, Hamish MacMillan & Will Sloss** all GGS; **Harry Graham & William May** from GC; and **Eddie Manton** from MGS. This has been a fantastic initiative and the enthusiasm of the school guys has reinvigorated the team. It has been great to see a few of our boys furthering their football education with selection in the OGS Senior side (**Rupert De Crespigny, Rupert Kemp & Andy De Fegely** matching it with the big boys!). The support from the players parents has been exceptional this year with **Simon Kemp, Rob De Fegely, Tony Robinson & Hugh McDonald** regulars in taking on goal umpiring or time keeping duties, but a special thanks must go to **Cathie Kemp** for the orchestrating morning tea’s catch-ups for the Under 19 parents at home games. **Peter Lemon, Jimmy Legoe & Josh Sumura** have also been great helpers in helping get the “Unders” to where they are today. On behalf of the team, we are very excited about the challenges that remain for the rest of the year.

Marcus Hastings (#44) – 30 Years Old

During the off-season, the Club were fortunate to secure 'Hasto' as our Senior Assistant Coach, with his intention to do so in a playing capacity. Unfortunately for him and the Club, injuries have meant he has been assisting from the sidelines rather than on the field, although he hopes that this will change in the back half of the season. Hasto grew up just over the border in NSW (Jerilderie) where he began his football career and has since played at North Albury, Barooga, Darley and Old Scotch, typically as a key forward. He has been impressed with the structure of the Club (from top to bottom) and comments "everyone is working towards sustained success across the next few years. We really have a base to move the club forward and up the grades". Welcome aboard Hasto.

Paul Ellis (#70) – 32 Years Old

Hasto also brought to the Club his great mate Paul Ellis, whom he has played football with at Barooga and Old Scotch. Other Clubs that 'Ella' has played at include Northern Bullants, West Preston and more recently Seymour in the GVFL. Rocky was appointed to our leadership group, having vice-captained Werribee in the VFL where he has played for the past few years. The professionalism that Rocky has shown on the training track and on the field is certainly cannot be under-estimated with his guidance to teammates in the midfield providing us with many clearance opportunities early in the season. Whilst a couple of small setbacks have hampered his first season at the Club, he is looking forward to a consistent back half of the year and comments that the Club is "moving in the right direction."

Reece Cordy (#49) – 24 Years Old

'Cordz' is another recruit with Geelong College foundations and the only of our new recruits to have played every senior game this season.
